Nomination	 All students must be nominated by their home university to be considered as an international exchange applicant. Each nomination should include: Full name as appears in Passport Student E-mail address Gender Date of birth in DD-MM-YYYY format Nationality Student home address Term of Exchange; Year of Exchange The application will require more information; however, please include the above information in the nomination email. Student Application Process	Students can access the <u>application portal</u> and required documents online at the <u>https://overseas.wustl.edu/admission.</u> Fall applications open November 1, Spring applications open March 1.

Academic Information		
Prerequisites	Students should review the prerequisites for courses online and should be able to demonstrate having met similar prerequisites in their home university.	
Grading & Credit Information	The normal workload of a full-time undergraduate student is 15 credit hours (approximately 5 classes). Each student must enroll in at least 12 credit hours and no more than 18 credit hours, in accordance with home-university approval. Please refer to the Arts & Sciences Grading Scale.	
Courses & Registration	Once admitted, students will complete a registration worksheet and work with the inbound exchange advisor to select suitable courses. The inbound exchange advisor will register students prior to arrival. Upon arrival, students may add and drop courses within a specific timeframe, provided there are seats remaining in the desired course. More details will be provided to students after admission.	

Immigration

Exchange students at Washington University are required to apply for a student visa (J-1) prior to arrival in the USA unless they hold a US passport. Admission to the exchange program is conditional upon receipt of legal status for the duration of the program. Upon successful completion of the application for admission, the Exchange Advisor will work with the Washington University Office of International Student & Scholars to provide documentation necessary in order for the student to apply for a visa, which includes a DS-2019 document. Upon receipt of the DS-2019, students should immediately schedule a visa appointment with the US consulate.

Learn about applying for a visa on the <u>U.S. Department of State website</u>. Select the menu labeled "Study & Exchange" and follow the "Exchange Visitor Visa" link. Students may enter the United States up to 30 days prior to the start date and remain for 30 days after the end date stated on their DS-2019. Students must remain enrolled as a full-time student to maintain their visa status.

Health Insurance

All exchange students are required by Student Health Services (SHS) to complete online forms, including medical & health history, immunizations, and meningitis information. Additionally, Washington University has a mandatory health insurance policy that all international students are required to purchase.
