JGU O.P. JINDAL GLOBAL UNIVERSITY

O.P. Jindal Global University (JGU) is a non-profit global university established by the Government of Haryana and recognised by the University Grants Commission (UGC). JGU was established as a philanthropic initiative of its Founding Chancellor, Mr. Naveen Jindal in memory of his father, Mr. O.P. Jindal. JGU is one of the few universities in Asia that maintains a 1:9 faculty-student ratio and appoints faculty members from India and different parts of the world with outstanding academic qualifications and experience. JGU is a research intensive university, which is deeply committed to its core institutional values of interdisciplinary and innovative pedagogy, pluralism, rigorous scholarship and globalism, and international engagement.

JGU has established 12 schools: Jindal Global Law School (JGLS); Jindal Global Business School (JGBS); Jindal School of International Affairs (JSIA); Jindal School of Government and Public Policy (JSGP); Jindal School of Liberal Arts & Humanities (JSLH); Jindal School of Journalism & Communication (JSJC); Jindal School of Art & Architecture (JSAA); Jindal School of Banking & Finance (JSBF); Jindal School of Environment & Sustainability (JSES); Jindal School of Psychology & Counselling (JSPC); Jindal School of Languages & Literature (JSLL) and Jindal School of Public Health and Human Development (JSPH). JGU has been granted "autonomy" by the University Grants Commission and the Ministry of Education, Government of India, for receiving the "A" Grade from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). This makes JGU the only private university in the state of Haryana and one of the only two private universities in India to be given the status of autonomy.

JGU has emerged as India's No. 1 Private University for the third year in a row, according to the QS World University Rankings 2023 and was ranked among the Top 700 universities in the world. We are also among the Top 150 universities globally under the age of 50 years by the QS Young University Rankings 2022. JGU has also been recognised in the Top 500 Universities as per the QS Graduate Employability Rankings 2022.

In September 2019, JGU was selected as an 'Institution of Eminence' (IOE) by the Government of India, making JGU one of only eight private universities in India to be awarded this status.

JINDAL SCHOOL OF INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

Jindal School of International Affairs (JSIA) is India's first global policy school. JSIA has been offering a 3-year B.A. (Hons.) Political Science programme since 2020. It has been designed with a focus on national, regional, and global political issues, to train students for a wide variety of careers by gaining a firm grasp of the fundamentals of political affairs and analysis. The programme gives students exposure to practice and to related disciplines and domains, to equip them to navigate this rapidly changing field. JSIA has also been offering a 2-year Master's degree in Diplomacy, Law and Business (M.A. DLB) since 2011, a 3-year B.A. (Hons.) Global Affairs programme since 2015, a 3-year BA [Hons.] Diplomacy & Foreign Policy programme since 2022, and a Ph.D. in International Affairs since 2016. From 2023 onwards, all undergraduate programmes are of 4 years. JSIA has now opened admissions to the 4-year BA [Hons.] Political Science programme for the academic year 2023-24 [classes will commence on August 1, 2023].





JSIA's main objective is to generate and spread interdisciplinary social science knowledge that informs current and future policymaking, via rigorous academic training of qualified graduate students. This dovetails with JGU's overall institutional goal of becoming a knowledge storehouse in the social sciences, which have been long played second fiddle to the hard sciences in Indian academia.

Although the need for building a world class school as a game changer in political studies education in India has been expressed in many quarters, no university has yet walked the talk by creating one. As JGU's third School-following the Jindal Global Law School (JGLS) and the Jindal Global Business School (JGBS) – JSIA aims to act as a corrective to the sliding standards of research in political studies departments and programmes across India.

By attracting internationally qualified faculty members and pooling together minds from a number of inter-related academic disciplines under a single School, JSIA is positioning itself as a producer of knowledge and shaper of careers in political affairs.

Political studies in India require a quantum leap in terms of in-depth thematic and geographic understanding of issues. JSIA's cutting-edge research and publications agenda and collaborations with international academic and policy institutions are meant to generate continuous scholarly output on hitherto neglected issue areas that comprise the fast expanding realm of 'political studies'.

India's voice on national and global political issues must be strengthened via concrete policy contributions to outstanding problems. JSIA will be a nucleus of this historic agenda.



A versatile social science degree that leads to a deeper understanding of the world and opens up diverse career paths



PROGRAMME MODALITIES

The B.A.(Hons.) Pol.Sc. degree is a four-year undergraduate programme dedicated to the study of both established and emerging domains of politics. Political science involves the description and analysis of different political systems, political behaviour, classical and new theoretical approaches to politics, and how politics is practiced. This degree aims to train students in all forms and manifestations of politics in arenas from local, state, national and international levels. Rapid technological change and new global challenges are pushing the boundaries of the traditional domains of social science analysis. We take a holistic, interdisciplinary, and skills-focused approach to the study of politics to equip our students to deal with these new challenges as analysts, practitioners, and leaders.

Topics covered in the curriculum include states and institutions, political behaviour and communication,

public opinion and voting, and regional issues and perspectives in national politics, as well as a global perspective on politics including peace and conflict studies, international cooperation, globalisation, and different forms of government.

Another novelty of this programme is that it provides students deep knowledge of politics of different regions including Europe, the Middle East and North Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean, Afghanistan, and China and Southeast Asia, and emerging economies and the global south, as well as the opportunity to take interdisciplinary elective courses on new national and global challenges like the changing landscape of war, nuclear proliferation, nationalism and populism, urban politics and infrastructure, transnational organized crime, human rights and transnationalism, and gender and sexuality.

The conventional undergraduate degree in Political Science fails to take into account contemporary political developments of the world that have changed the way politics is understood, usually from the Western world's vantage point. The courses focused on Indian and global political thought and perspectives we offer expand our analysis of politics beyond Western-centric frameworks, connecting India's politics and intellectual traditions to those from other global south countries.

The study of politics also requires sufficient background understanding of related social sciences and humanities. Students enrolled in this degree programme take foundational courses that include principles of economics, history, and philosophy so that students have a holistic and well-rounded understanding of political affairs. Existing Political Science Honours programmes in India tend to neglect these related disciplines, thus missing a vital component of developing a strong interpretation of the context behind political developments. At JSIA, students receive a grounding in core political science subjects as well as subjects from related disciplines so that they can tackle contemporary issues from an interdisciplinary perspective. Students in good standing are given the option to develop a regional or topical area of specialisation in their pathway through the programme, with faculty guidance.

As a world class university that is ideologically pluralistic, JSIA's B.A. (Hons.) P. Sc. will equip students with thorough understanding of multiple ideological perspectives in the Indian context and worldwide. Political science as a discipline emphasizes neutrality and pluralism, and students are taught to go beyond perspectives covered in media in order to develop their own analysis and political commitments rigorously and freely. Students learn from multiple disciplines and ideological frameworks, as well as insights from theory and practice, through courses taught by our diverse international faculty that includes political scientists, sociologists, economists, historians and diplomats.

Experiential and immersive learning also takes place in class and on campus. Our innovative pedagogy includes simulations, site visits and guest

speakers, advanced training in research methods used by practitioners, and collaborations with partner organisations. We offer on-campus opportunities for learning and research collaboration, including through faculty mentored independent research and collaborations in JGU's research centers focusing on topics that are missing or underrepresented in Indian academia. Our advanced research electives offer methodological training in research skills used by practitioners as well as academics. Students are encouraged and guided to develop an area of specialisation through their choice of internships and placements as well as their third year electives. Unlike most other political science programs, we offer the option of language learning to complement regional specialisations through our electives. Students can focus on Europe. China, Latin America, as well as regions closer to home like Southeast Asia and Afghanistan.

Students enrolled in the B.A. (Hons.) P.Sc. programme can also opt for elective courses from their second semester onwards. The combination of courses in domestic politics, global political economy, foreign affairs and comparative politics will give students a special edge, as no other undergraduate degree programme in India offers as substantial a range of options on international, comparative, and regional politics. Our programme also strongly emphasizes the development of critical, analytical, research, and oral and written communication skills. Students are taught vital skills in writing, communication in a wide variety of registers beyond the academic alone, and critical thinking and presentation skills in both foundational and elective courses. Our students are encouraged to plan their own learning pathways through the careful and intentional choice of internship opportunities, electives, and research with the help of one-on-one faculty mentoring beginning from when students enter the programme.



INTERNATIONAL STUDY OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS

JSIA provides students with the opportunity to learn from world-renowned faculty from prestigious international institutions. Students can avail of the following kinds of study abroad opportunities:

Short Term Study Abroad Programmes: Students can opt for summer schools at the University of Oxford, the U.K., The Fletcher School at the University of Tufts, the USA, and UN-Geneva Winter School. This opportunity is available to both M.A. and B.A. students.

Semester Exchange: The student spends a semester at a partner university while paying tuition only at JSIA. JSIA has semester exchange collaborations with some of the top schools in international affairs. These include University of Warsaw, Sciences Po, Comillas Pontifical University, and Sabanci University, among others. This opportunity is available to both M.A. and B.A. students.

Pathway Programme: JSIA-King's College (London) Pathway Programme: JSIA and King's College Pathway Programme is a demanding, selective option that allows qualified students of BAPS and BAGA Programmes an opportunity to earn an M.Sc. Degree in Global Affairs from the King's College London upon completion of their undergraduate degree.

Dual Degree: Graduate student completes one year of the M.A. (DLB) programme at JSIA and the second year at a partner University. Undergraduate students opting for a dual degree spend their first two years at JSIA and transfer to our partner university for the last two years. At the end of their time, they earn a degree from both institutions.



INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIPS

JSIA offers unique opportunities to students by providing them full-time internships abroad. For example, the Centre for African Latin American and Caribbean Studies (CALACS) sent two students - Sanjana Medipally, BA (Hons.) GA (2015 batch) & Aakanksha Lohia BA (Hons.) GA (2016 batch) - to Brazil in 2017 on a fully funded field internship.

O.P. Jindal Global University awards Merit cum Means Scholarships (MCM) every year. The MCM Scholarship covers the tuition fee only. Scholarship applications will be opened by the University by April and will be awarded to eligible students in July. The eligibility criteria includes annual family income, Graduation score, entrance examination results and faculty interview score. Weightage will also be given to curricular and non-curricular achievements.
